

A Profile of BC College Transfer Students Admitted to the University of British Columbia

1993/94 to 1997/98

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Summary

UBC ADMITS BETWEEN 1,100 AND 1,500 students transferring from B.C. colleges annually. B.C. college transfers comprise 15% to 20% of all registered undergraduate admissions. The majority of these students come to UBC from the lower mainland, and this proportion has been steadily increasing.

College transfers from outside the lower mainland exhibit a slight tendency to enter UBC with a greater number of college credits than do those from within the lower mainland. University College of the Cariboo students tend to enter with the most transfer credits; BCIT and Emily Carr students show the largest percentage of students transferring with fewer than 30 credits.

The number of first year credit hours taken by college transfer students differs substantially from that of high school admissions. College transfer students are much more likely to be part-time students than are high school admissions. Transfer students from outside the lower mainland tend to take higher course loads than those from the lower mainland.

A large majority of transfer students enter the faculties of Arts or Science, accounting for 63% of enrolment. The faculties of Applied Science and Commerce, and the School of Human Kinetics also receive high enrolment. Compared with high school admissions, college transfer students are less likely to enter the Faculties of Science and Applied Science, and more likely to enter Commerce and Human Kinetics.

College transfer students pursuing a B.Sc. in Physical Therapy, a B.Sc. in Pharmacy, or a B.Sc. in Occupational Therapy tend to have the highest average

admission GPAs.

Students at UBC may choose from over one hundred different programs, but college transfer enrolment is highest in Biology, Psychology, Human Kinetics, and Computer Science. Compared with high school admissions, college transfer students have a higher probability of enrolling in Human Kinetics.

College transfer students tend to be much older than high school admissions. While the vast majority of entering high school students are under the age of 20, the largest cohort for college transfer students is aged 20-24, with significant numbers of students aged over 25. The average college transfer is four to five years older than the average high school admission.

Overall, the percentage of female college transfers (54%) is similar to that for high school admissions (56%). One institution stands out as very different in terms of gender distribution: over 78% of the students transferring from Emily Carr Institute of Art and Design are female (the next highest proportion are from the Open University, at 66% female).

Transfer students from all colleges experience a decrease in measured academic performance in their first year at UBC relative to their entry grade. On average the drop is 4 percentage points. By the end of students' second year at UBC, the drop in percentage is partially recovered, with an average increase from the prior year of 2 percentage points. The recovery continues through the average student's career until GPA is again at par with admission average.

Of those students admitted on the basis of College Transfer in 1993/94 and 1994/95, 75% completed a degree within five years of entering UBC. The percentage of students who graduate tends to increase with the number of transfer credits: students with fewer than 30 credits have a graduation

rate of 54%, whereas those with more than 55 credits have a graduation rate of 84%. The average grades for college transfer and high school admissions upon degree completion are 74% and 75% respectively.

Of the 6,224 students admitted to UBC on the basis of transfer from a B.C. college over the period from 1993/94 to 1997/98, 2,504 (or 40%) obtained a UBC degree. The number will continue to increase for some time, as many of these students are still in progress toward a degree. On average, college transfer students took 2.5 Winter sessions to complete a degree; again, this number will increase when students still in progress eventually complete. Most students who finish a degree within the 5 year time frame do so on a full-time basis.

Definitions

College Transfer Student

A STUDENT ADMITTED TO A UBC FAC-ULTY on the basis of a minimum of 24 credits obtained at one or more colleges in transferable courses. Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.00, but individual faculties may, as a consequence of enrolment quotas, set a higher admission standard.

College of Transfer

The college of transfer, if the student has attended more than one college, is that institution from which most credits were transferred.

B.C. High School admission

A student admitted to a UBC faculty on the basis of high school comple-

tion. Such a student may also have credit from a college towards a degree, but the grades on which the admission is granted are from the high school records.

Grading systems

UBC grades are expressed as a percentage. College students are admitted on the basis of a four point scale. For a comparison of averages (see Table 10) grade points have been mapped to percentage points, but it is a rough conversion: inferences drawn from this table should not be given the same weight as others.

Full-time and part-time

A full-time student is defined as a student enrolling in 24 or more credits in the Winter Session. A student enrolling in less than 24 credits is defined as part-time. The typical UBC program (e.g. B.A. Arts) would require a student to register in 30 credits for each of four Winter sessions, although some programs require more than 30 credits per session.

Unclassified students

Students who are registered at UBC, but have not been admitted to a degree program in a particular faculty.

Degrees and programs of study

A degree program consists of a degree, as well as a program within that degree. For example, students may choose the Bachelor of Arts degree, and the Economics program within that faculty. Degrees shown in Table 17 are abbreviated as shown below.

Session

Grade and year level data for this report is based on enrolment in the UBC Winter session only, which begins in September and ends in April of the following year. The session is divided into two terms, but some courses may span both terms. The term "year" is also used interchangeably with "session."

Last Session

The last session (if not a first or second session) attended by each student during the time-frame of the study regardless of graduation.

Transfer credit

Credit toward a degree program at UBC based on courses successfully completed at a college.

Degree completion

A student is defined as having completed a degree in either May or November of the year if the student has applied to graduate and has successfully completed the degree requirements. The date at which a student is recorded as having completed the degree may not be the date at which the student has completed all course requirements. Many students continue to enroll in courses without obtaining a degree for some time.

Other institutions

"Other institutions" comprise the Open University and instances where the college is unknown.

Introduction

THIS REPORT REPRESENTS THE SECOND comprehensive profile of the more than six thousand students who entered UBC as college transfer students over a five-year period (in this study, between 1993/94 and 1997/98. This report was first undertaken last year at the behest of the British Columbia Council on Admissions and Transfers and was modeled on a similar study first completed by Simon Fraser University in October 1996. Hence report designs and definitions were, when possible, intended for comparison with the Simon Fraser study.

The data for this study comprises 6,224 students who were admitted to faculties at UBC on the basis of admission "College Transfer".

Some students with college transfer credit are admitted on the basis of their high school performance instead; this study does not identify such students as "College Transfer," but as "High School Entry."

If a College Transfer student has attended more than one college, we deem the college of transfer to be that institution from which most credits were transferred. The twenty colleges and technical institutes represented in this report are organized by geographical regions within British Columbia.

Note also that the total number of college transfer students (and, for comparison, high school admissions) varies among tables. This is due mainly to variations in the size of the examined cohort (eg. a smaller number graduate than are admitted).

Profile of B.C. College Transfer Students

Table 1
Year of Admission

UBC admits between 1,100 and 1,500 students transferring from B.C. colleges annually. High School entries account for more than twice as many admissions each year.

Slightly fewer college transfer students were admitted from 96/97 to 97/98, from 1418 such students to 1366. The majority of college transfer students come to UBC from lower mainland colleges (79.6% in 1997/98), only a slight increase from the year before (79.1%) but a significant increase from the first year of this study (only 71.5%). As the proportion of lower mainland students rises, non-lower mainland enrolments necessarily decrease, from 93/94's 26.7% to the current 19%.

Langara College (formerly a campus of Vancouver Community College) supplies UBC with more college transfer students than any other institution. Including enrolments from VCC in 1993-1995, Langara students totalled 1621, 26.0% of all transfers in the five-year period. This fraction has remained relatively stable.

Approximately half of all college transfers to UBC are from three lower mainland colleges: Langara/VCC, Capilano, and Kwantlen.

From outside the lower mainland, the largest number of transfers came from Okanagan University College (6.6% of the total). The three Northern B.C. colleges provided, on average, only 2.8% of the total transfer students, and only 2.1% in the most recent year (in 1993/94 they had yielded 5.0%); a possible explanation for this change is the advent of UNBC.

The increases in enrolment seen in 1996/97 are attributable to UBC's responding to increases in funded enrolment.

Table 2

Transfer Credits at Admission

Most college transfers enter UBC with between 1 and 2 years of credit. Students from the Interior/Kootenays transfered with the most credits (fully 34.4% of their students had greater than 55 credits, while 28.3% of public lower mainland students had greater than 55 credits and only 20.5% of Vancouver Island students had the same.

Students with the fewest transfer credits tended to come from BCIT (69.0% had less than a full year) or Emily Carr (at 78.6%).

Prior to 1995/96, the UBC had maintained records for only those transfer credits which went toward the degree

program in which a student was registered. A more accurate depiction of the numbers would thus reveal total transfer credits being higher than shown, as the first two years in this study (93/94, 94/95) do not include those non-program transfer credits.

Although full-time is defined as 24 or more credits, 30 credits is more typical

of a required full-time load (the actual requirement varies among departments). While 70.4% of high school admissions enrolled in 24 or more credits in their first year, only 43.2% of college transfer stu-

dents did so. Transfer students from outside the lower mainland tended to take higher course loads than those from the lower mainland; 57.1% of non-lower mainland students take over 28 credits, versus 39.2% of lower mainland students.

Considering the strict definition of full-time status as being 24 or more credits, the

difference between high school and college entry students are similar to the differences shown in Table 3a. Again, high school admissions enrol in more courses (94.6% are full-time) than college transfer students (74.2%).

Students from outside the lower mainland show a slightly higher percentage (83.2%) of full-time students than do those from the lower mainland (71.7%).

Although students from North Island College enrol full-time more frequently (92.3%) than from any other single institution, on a regional basis it is Northern BC students who maintain the highest workload: 87.0% are full-time.

While Emily Carr and BCIT students appear to have a light workload, these figures should be interpreted with caution: both institutions send very small numbers to UBC, and both institutions are not typical of the average transfer college. Likewise, data for Northern Lights College should be carefully considered throughout this report as this college has the smallest numbers transferring to UBC.

Faculty of Intended Major

The majority of new UBC students tend to enter either one of the three faculties Arts, Science, and to a lesser extent, Applied Science (Engineering), or they enter the School of Human Kinetics (within the Faculty of Education). These four choices take in 90.8% of all high school admissions, and 78.5% of college transfers.

College transfer students are just as likely as high school students to enter the Faculty of Arts (45.8 and 44.5%), but more likely than high school students to enter a faculty other than Science or Applied Science (only 24.2% of transfer students enter these two faculties, whereas 45.2% of high school admissions do.)

Lower mainland transfer students are much more likely to enrol in the Faculty of Arts (51.5%) than are non-lower mainland students (27.7%). Lower mainland students are also much less likely to enter the Faculty of Science (14.2%) than are transfers from outside the lower mainland (27.9%).

The private colleges show a high proportion of students selecting Applied Science (18.0%), as does Camosun College (13.2%). Northwest, and Okanagan show relatively high percentages transferring into Science (as does Northern Lights, but with much smaller numbers), and several colleges (BCIT, Cariboo, North Island) show higher than average fractions of students entering Forestry.

Note that high school students are not usually admitted to certain faculties until they have completed coursework or degrees (e.g. Commerce, Law).

College transfer students tend to be much older than high school admissions. While the vast majority of high school admissions are under the age of 20 at the time of entry, the largest cohort for college transfer students is aged 20-24, with significant numbers of students aged over 25. The average college transfer is four to five years older than the average high school admission.

Students coming from non-lower mainland colleges are on average younger than their lower mainland counterparts, especially those students transferring from Northwest (56.9% under 20), Selkirk (34.6%) and Okanagan (19.8%).

Overall, only 10.6% of lower mainland transfers are under 20, as opposed to 21.4% of non-lower mainland transfers.

Transfer students coming from the two institutes are much older on average than those from other sources, with the 25-and-over group accounting for 61.9% of BCIT transfers, and 57.1% of Emily Carr students (compared to 20.2% of all transfers, and only 0.3% of high school admissions.)




Overall, the percentage of female college transfers (53.9%), is similar to that for high school admissions (55.8%).



Admission Percentages

The admission percentages shown are derived by conversion from the 4 point scale (used by most colleges) to the equivalent percentage stored on UBC records. The minimum average required for admission to UBC, 2.00, is converted to a value of 60%.

The percentages are those associated with the most recent institution attended, hence for students who attended more than one previous institution, the percentage shown may not have been the only criterion for admission. Only ten students (a fifth of one percent) show percentages below the minimum required.

The median of 72.5% would correspond to slightly under a 3.0 grade point average. Seventy-five percent of all college transfers are admitted with a percentage of 75 or less, (equivalent to a grade point average of 3.20).

Table 10

Performance by Session

The academic performance (i.e. percentage grade earned) of BC college transfers is shown at four distinct points in the students' academic progression: at admission; at the end of their first session at UBC; at the end of their second session at UBC; and at the end of their last (not necessarily final) session at UBC.

Transfer students on average experience a decrease in measured academic per-

formance in their first year at UBC relative to their entry grade, with BCIT students providing an exception by showing a slight increase of 0.5 percentage points.

The drop in performance averages out to 3.5 percentage points from admission to end of first year. The largest drop is seen in students from Selkirk College (-9.1 points) while BCIT students are alone in raising their average (by 2.9 points). The typical drop in percentage is greater for transfers from outside the lower mainland (-4.9 versus -2.9 points).

By the end of students' second year at UBC, the drop in percentage is partially recovered, with an average increase for the session from the prior year of 2.0 percentage

points. Emily Carr students gained the most ground (an increase of 5.7 points) and Columbia College students gained none at all.

Grades continue to climb. By the last session the session average has increased again (by 2.9 points from second session), with grades now being slightly higher than what they were at admission. The Grades of Okanagan students are particularly strong (a 4.1 point increase from admission by the last session), while Coquitlam students don't recover from their early drop, finishing 5.2 points down from average at admission.

By the time of the last session, on average the non-lower mainland students show more significant improvement than those from the lower mainland.

Little can be said by comparing the high school admission average to the college transfer average since these are not on comparable scales. Once both groups of students are at university, however, their subsequent performance can be compared. In selected high enrolling courses, high school students outperform college transfer students by 3.3 percentage points (on

average by course).

without significant, if any, transfer credits, and thus by the final year of our study only attain a 51.1% completion rate. Given enough time, the graduation rate for high school admissions has historically been 65%, with most of the attrition taking

place after first year.

The percentage of students who graduate within four or five years of entering UBC increases with the number of transfer credits; students with fewer than 30 credits have a graduation rate of

54.1%, those with more than 55 credits have a graduation rate of 84.4%. Students with fewer transfer credits also obviously require more years to complete.

UBC does not compute a cumulative GPA for its completing students; we do, however, have an average for the last session attended.

Looking at the last session average has some drawbacks (e.g., it fails to permit ready comparisons to other universities' data) but it has one significant advantage, in that it is untainted by the substantially lower early grades received by transfer students in their first and second years at UBC (as shown in Table 10).

The average grades for college transfer students and high school admissions upon degree completion are 73.9% and 75.4% respectively; 34.6% of high school admissions have a session average of 80% or more, compared with 29.5% of college transfers.

The last session averages show that for students who persist in their studies and obtain a degree, the college transfer route is neither markedly better or worse in terms of academic achievement than direct entry from high school. Both routes to a degree are equally viable.

Performance by Session

Like Table 10, Table 14 shows a similar increase in grades as students progress.

Students from outside the Lower Mainland showed a greater tendency to improve their grades after the first session, gaining on average 4.4 percentage points, where Lower Mainland students gained 2.7.

The Winter Session at UBC comprises the academic year from September through to the following April. The measure "average number of winter sessions" is roughly equivalent to the number of years taken to complete the degree (though some students do attend in summer). On average, transfer students took 2.5 Winter sessions to complete the degree. As a consequence of the brief time frame of this study, only fulltime transfer students have (thus far) completed their degrees, and we know college transfer students are more likely to be part time.

The average time to completion, as well as the total degrees completed, would naturally increase should we follow these cohorts for several more years.
