 - Discussed the challenges for both instructors and students around i) teaching fundamental courses in an online environment. Shared ideas about how to best support students: asynchronous links to videos, drop-in Teams sessions; screen shots and links to D2L videos showing students how to upload into Moodle; screen sharing instruction is crucial for fundamental learners; sharing digital literacy resources and supports among community partners; utilizing \$25 000 ministry funded support for technology needs for students; hiring of a specialty instructor teach all departmental students a 2-day introductory session to increase digital equity and understanding of online learning tools before classes start; Remind app useful for quick communications between students and instructor without having to share personal phone number; Open Broadcast Studio – demonstrated by Alex as a useful tool in a synchronous class environment on most platforms. ACTION: Reach out to Alex if you need support using this with your online classes.
 - ii) Alex mentioned a new ABE course at VIU designed for SD 79 teachers: How to Teach Programming. Feedback from the group was positive.
