a) Heather Collins, Senior Policy Advisor, Ministry of Post-Secondary Education & Future Skills

- i. Leadership updates: Feb 2024 – New Minister - Lisa Beare; Jan 2024 Director, Adult Learning, Education and Human Services, Darryl Soper returns.
- ii. Call for proposal in Jan 2024 for pathways funding. CFP has now closed. Funding letters have been sent. Public communications to come in June.
- iii. In first year of funding cycle for Community Adult Literacy, small grants to community and indigenous organizations and post-secondary institutions. Supporting 102 literacy programs delivered in 132 communities across BC.
- iv. Name change in process: Adult Special Education → Accessible Education and Training (AET)
- v. Data has shown that students taking ABE, ELL, AET and other programs are having greater rates of success in post-secondary.
- vi. Question – Ukrainian students on CUAET visa may not be eligible for AUG funding.
 - 1. Answer – Currently not eligible. Will forward question

Action: Heather Collins will forward question on Ukrainian students on CUAET visa to colleague Miles Steyn and email co-chairs of BCCAT EAL committee with answer.

3.) Working Groups complete articulation work. (2 hours)

a. EAP Working Group meeting: discussion of new articulations and changes:

i. BCIT ISEP 0506

Discussion:

Reading IV:

- Reading – Reading outcome 1 and 6 descriptions do not align between the major changes document submitted and the EAP IV Reading outcome 1 and 6; course outlines may cover the outcome in areas of the course outline; recommend refining course objectives to meet EAP IV Reading outcomes 1 and 6.
- Reading outcome 12 – course outline objective does not fully match as only addresses target vocabulary rather than strategic competence regarding unfamiliar words; recommendation to change outcome 12 in outline to match.
- Reading outcome 15 – literary analysis outcome may not be met in objective; literature not strongly represented in the course; do not assess literary devices; recommend striking EAP IV Reading outcome 15.

Writing IV

- Writing – Writing outcome 3 description does not match EAP III outcome – not currently a match as revision of writing is not an objective in course (only in assessment portion)
- Writing outcome 6 – Missing opposing viewpoints – Scenarios in course outline may including persuasive reports. Need to be edited in course outline and major course 6.
- Writing outcome 8 – Committee does not find thesis development in the course outline. – not currently a match;
- Writing outcome 12 – Not clear that writing tasks are meeting a balance of original writing and documented source writing; – use LO #4 1.4, 1.5, 1.10 in to match writing outcome 12.
- Writing outcome 13 – performance condition not met ISEP 0506 requires only 1-2 paragraphs
- Writing performance conditions C – do not meet extended length composition requirement (longest composition is 500 words)
- ISEP 0506 meets only 8 of 13 EAP IV Writing outcomes are met. 61% match.
- ISEP 0506 meets 4 of 5 or 80% of EAP IV Writing Performance Conditions
- Committee finds that ISEP 0506 does not currently articulate with Writing EAP IV outcomes.

Action: Gordana Sokic (Douglas) to meet with Steve Lobo (BCIT) regarding EAP Articulation changes needed for ISEP 0506. Geoff Taylor to send summary of notes to Gordana and Steve. <Geoff Taylor (SFU); Gordana Sokic (Douglas); Steve Lobo (BCIT)>

- Example: SFU articulation in October 2020, effective date is listed as 2022. Course has not actually changed, the only change was how the name of the course was captured in the BC Transfer Grid in 2022. The date is not correct. VCC issues with registrar not accepting course dates prior to start date.

- **Question:** Does Articulation expire? A: Articulation does not expire currently.
