2. Introductions/welcome

4. Business Arising from Previous Minutes

- The motion from the 2024 meeting, "That the Women's Studies committee change its name to Gender, Sexuality and Women's Studies (GSWS) committee" was circulated for a vote by April 30, 2025. The name change was unanimously approved (13 YES votes, 1 did not respond). BCCAT has been notified and will be updating the committee name on the BCCAT website.
- M. Singh to share info about how people are responding to onslaught of AI on assignments. Langara does not have a coherent institutional response. What she had is now outdated.
 - Tiffany provided links about SFU and the use of AI in her report.
 - Emma AI has undermined the "essay" as a major assignment. Reverberations about AI extend beyond AI. Academic integrity hard to police.
 - Janet AI has impacted integrity of the paper. AI can't discuss emotions or concepts such as white privilege. More personal reflections. Going towards "unpapers" so portfolios or the construction of blogs, debates, mock trials. Creative solutions. Trying to be innovative to achieve authentic assessments.

- 6. Presentation of Institutional Reports
 - a. Please see institutional reports
 - i. General and/or novel themes AI; cutbacks; layoffs; removing credentials; creation of minor in some programs; budgeting decisions sometimes confusing; solidarity across GSW to maintain its importance as a pillar of postsecondary education; colleges seem to be impacted more than universities; some schools feel pressure to be neoliberal marketers; mindset changing from having students registered in courses to the number of majors as indicators
 - M. Singh What kind of solidarity would we have about the preservation of GSW program's across the committee?
 - 2. Vaibhav Associate Dean wanted a list of articulated courses but there was some pushback from other departments because of revenue crunch. That is, articulation agreements have been student-centred and flexible, but courses that don't transfer

- exactly may be in danger of not articulating as well as they have in the past. Coalition building was highlighted as an option that we explore.
- 3. M. Singh What is streamlining? Interdisciplinary studies hasn't had an indication that certain courses weren't meeting the bar (even through program review). Dean says he sees enrolments in the program, but students are not completing the credentials. Removing the credentials impacts the stability of the program. Streamlining means removing the credentials associated with the program.
- 4. Students inquiring about practicality of credential designation (ie what is it that I can do with X credential?)
- 7. BCCAT Report Fionna MacQuarrie
 - a. Articulation meetings are a place for BCCAT and also a place of solidarity across disciplines
 - b. More than 60 articulation committees.
 - i. BCCAT encourages in-person meetings with online options.
 - ii. Concerns with cutbacks and international enrolments.
 - 1. Some concerns about tariffs and potential impacts on programs.
 - iii. BCCAT one of the best transfer credit systems in the world.
 - 1. Helps efficiency and provides students options and flexibility.
 - iv. JAM Brings together participants.
 - 1. Next year Jam is Nov 6 and 7.
 - a. November 6 is online
 - b. November 7 is hybrid
 - Switching to Pheedloop platform
 - ii. Every session from last year's jam is on the BCCAT youtube channel.
 - c. Some pushback from institutions sending attendees (re: travel funding).
 - i. This is stated in Articulation Research Guide

 - iv. TCS allows institutions to send and receive requests. Ontario is adapting BC's system for their use. Running by June/July. This software has the capability to link systems from BC and Ontario for transfer credit evaluation
