4. Approval of previous minutes of the BCCAT Biology Articulation Committee meeting of May 4th – 5th 2017 (Simon Fraser University)

5. BCCAT report (Meg Stainsby, Director of Transfer and Articulation)

Summary and discussion highlights:

- 1. Spring update is available on the BCCAT website
- 2. Several reports are underway:
 - International Transfer Credit assessment: how do language proficiency measures compare? This is a timely study due to the recent and significant influx of international students to many institutions
 - Interdisciplinary Transfer: Challenges for students taking interdisciplinary studies when trying to transfer to and from institutions
 - Indigenous Learning: A survey of persistence, barriers, and graduation success rates for indigenous learners. Phase 1 includes institutional data collection; phase 2 is a qualitative study from the perspective of the indigenous learners
 - Trades ← Academics Movement: Study of pathways of students who want to transfer between academics and trades in both directions
- BCCAT is working on coordinating block transfer agreements. The course-to-course transfer guide is robust, but the block transfer guide is not. A co-op student has completed a review of the currency of the transfer agreements, contacted institutions, and examined institutional websites

- 4. Transfer innovation funds are available on an application basis for projects that would benefit a discipline at all institutions (e.g. block transfer to multiple institutions, shared discipline specific test bank questions).
- 5. New transfer credit system software launched February 9th, replacing the old TCES software. This program allows for quick turnaround on requests and replies and formatting will be standardized to avoid idiosyncrasies.
- 6. BCCAT is posting for a faculty 50-100% secondment for an extra research and writing person to help tie up some projects. Position will be posted in the next couple of weeks for a release in fall.
- 7. From BC Campus: Indigenization project underway to create a toolkit of resources for faculty to indigenize programs, courses, and institutions
- 8. K-12 Curriculum Changes- working with BC Ministry of Education. BCCAT invited the ministry to send representatives to articulation groups. Ministry of Education was not able to attend many in person. They sent some info through BCCAT representatives.
- 9. English 12 Assessment- In place for June 2020, British Columbia high school students will not graduate with letter grade but a ranking (emerging, meeting, exceeding etc., to be converted to some sort of system for coding). This will replace a pass/fail system.

- c. BCCAT and several other provinces are hoping to have a joint articulation for Western Canada. The hope is to coordinate with Alberta.

8. SLP report (Barbara Moon)

Province wide concerns:

Internationalization and Language Prerequisites: Language proficiency entrance tests and the IELTS are not corresponding. Numeracy is also coming up as a problem, particularly for students entering subjects requiring math (chemistry, economics, etc.) Most institutions are experiencing high waitlists and very full classrooms. Academic Fraud also cited as an increasing concern

Following a detailed discussion and testimonials from institutions where this was attempted the committee generally thought this would be difficult to pursue (e.g. hard to cover what's needed on one exam and needed concepts would differ across specialties, may be a barrier, etc.).
