8. Institutional Reports:

Paul Franklin: UFV

BS CS is starting in Fall. Took 10 years to get approval. Enrollments high International and plagiarism. Hire 3 LTA (1 year appointments) and 2 new positions for CS.

David: Selkirk

Domestic enrolment has declined. International FTE up 15% from last year. Comprise 20% in classroom. Lot of Indigenous projects and courses are being funded. Web and App Design course. Collaborate with VIU replacing the CRP system.

Starting a new Strategic plan cycle. New Building. New VPs. Language moving from Java to Python.

Note: Python: 9 Java 10: C++ 6

Bryan Greene: Langara

Enrolments up International (8 new sections added). Fall will need more Faculty. Overload is pay or bank. Day 3 of new structure. Now from 3 to 5 Deans. CS is now in Applied Sciences. Extra funding for Web development. Data Analytics BS in Bio Informatics.

Ahmed Malki: Alexander College:

22% increase over last year. Looking for a bigger campus. Issues with some International Students: submitting fraudulent documents (e.g., fake IELTS scores, false transcripts, etc.). Move to Canvas Learning system which they like. Students want more CS courses to be offered. AC has two campuses. Student population is over 2000. Four faculty in CS. Some International students have only seen programming but not actually done programming, this raises a problem with course transfer.

Frank Lu: North Island College

Some courses under Math and Science. Some under Fine Arts for Media courses. Teach Web and Mobile App development. Quality of grads is getting better. Working under 2 Deans and Frank works under 2 Deans and 3 departments. International Students show up in first week and then disappear. They want to live here and immigrate. New IT program (funding) with programming

How do we motivate them to get credentials?

(In order to write the final must attend 50% of their classes)(Take participation/attendance.) (Students cannot fail 3 courses or cannot stay in the country). If they fail 1 course it will affect their Visa application. Douglas can get an UN get an F. UN disqualifies them from student loans. F is ok to retake the course. Get fake doctor's note for \$49. (Doctor's note must be signed by a licensed doctor in the province done in Ontario). Alexander must have 70% attendance and no doctor's note except for midterm or final).

Advising is NB. We are not a HS and it is not our job to baby sit them. Why take attendance?

9. Fortinet: Ed Hargrave Major Accounts Manager – BC & Territories:

Higher Education is important.

Fortinet wants to hire 1000 developers by 2020. They are already hiring people.

New building in Feb 2018.

Fortinet is a Security Vendor who produce firewalls, Hardware, OS, and Technical Support.

Threat Research has 200 people today. Credited with over 500 zero day threats. Many patents and patents pending.

Fortinet gets great employees and a great place to set up a lab. Have a presence in the Valley. Founded in 2000 in Burnaby.

Built own Integrated Circuits. Developed own Operating System with a common platform. Unified Threat Management. Can put all on a single unit.

Make switches, firewalls, policy can be applied automatically. Host cloud services in Burnaby and backed up to Ottawa.

Burnaby has 1000 hires and open to 100 more. Primarily a Dev shop.

Fortinet takes New Grads: UBC,SFU,UVIC,BCIT, Dalhousie, U Ottawa, Waterloo, Toronto (27)

Most Bachelor degrees. (Work on Masters in Big Data)

Not a lot of Cyber Security so grads need to be trained from the ground up.

There is a need to program Security into our courses.

BC Aware had presentations from TRU.

Challenges with co-op. Not productive with Fortinet. Trouble with NDA and contracts. New HR is working more and more with co-op.

Threat Research: Detect in a timely manner. 5 million devices 2-way conversation connected and talking constantly. See threats developing quickly.

Human Analyst does most of the heavy lifting. People decide if this is a threat. Content Pattern Recognition Code.

Threat Information Service. Providing analysis of data in a web portal. See what other people are seeing. Have weekly and quarterly threat reports.

Fortinet Academy Program has certifications like CISCO Academy. Provide ready to use curriculum, hardware to work with this program. Dalhousie is a long standing member of this program. Close to working with UFV, UBC, SFU and UVic. Fortinet will work with faculty and provide guest lecturers etc. You don't have to sign up to the academy but you can work with Fortinet.

Veterans Program to help educate and employ veterans. Coming to Canada and in the States.

What would a student make upon earning a degree? Tend to pay the same as in the US. Fortinet is competitive and is looking for quality and in some areas they pay above.

Vancouver is a web and design city. UBC Computer Engineering over Computer Science. Typical Career Path:

R&D bring in 25 to 40 students every quarter. Visual analysis, malware analysis, support, work on the analyst end of the program. Make it human understandable.

Average employment 6-7 years

Can head to California or around the world as a career path.

Jenny Peters runs the Academy Program.

Sue Butler: UVic Academic Advisory

Student enrolment doubled. Students coming back to get a second degree. Quite a few from U of A.

Gara Pruesse: VIU

Need resources for CS. No new program did not receive a grant. Growth both International and Domestic International is 36%

Saryta Schaerer: Camosun College

Demand for 2year tech program. Cap 25% for International. High rate of 55 students going into year. CS is increasing as well. Extra programming classes in Fall and Winter.

Tech program needs to work with Industry and get CS and not IT people.

Patrice Belleville: UBC

Increasing majors within CS and students switching.

The department is https://www.cs.ubc.ca/50/ celebrating its 50 anniversary on Friday and Saturday, and there are several invited speakers.

George Tsiknis is retiring after 25 years in September.

Rick Sutcliffe: Trinity Western University

Private Christian University. International students are from China. University is tuition driven. Have research grants in Science 3.5 million to hire students. Students have to attend 75% of classes and Faculty have to put this on their Syllabus.

Trinity has four campuses: Langley, Richmond, Bellingham and Ottawa.

Motivation pay \$22,000 for tuition students are motivated. Math, CS, Math with Computing Started a new dorm for 160 students...tallest modular building in Canada. Sold out already. Faculty workload based on points. No Certificates but looking into this.

BCCEC history. First was Mathematics, Second Computing in mid 70's, long before BCCAT. Curriculum based on student outcomes from the Senate.

CS Degree graduated in 2000 and had problems getting jobs. 2010 suspended CS from the program. Program fully reinstated this month.

Catherine Maydan: KPU

New hires. Program review. Security Symposium June 22, 2018 Richmond Campus.

Simon Li: Douglas College

Currently has 26 full time regular faculty in the CSIS dept. and we are looking for 3 to 6 more in 18/19. There are about 20 contract sections in Fall 18

The Chair has been saying no to transfer credit requests to unknown international institutions Youry Khmelevsky:Okanagan College

Enrolment is full. New Chair Is James Nastos. All grads are fully employed according to BCCAT statistics. Now they can get TA's for 40 and above students. 8am and night classes to cover students.

Kelowna is at capacity. First year CS in Vernon and Penticton. These are capped as second year needs space and capacity. CS is Computer Science but CIS is Library Science in USA, what is confusing for the international students.

Joseph Fall: Capilano University

Capilano 2 years ago. Administration changed stepped down. 2016 new President etc. Good changes. A new STEM with Computing department. Will have BSc Environmental Technology. Data Science Undergrad and Post Bach. Run 16 courses with 35 students.

Diana Cukierman: SFU

Chair Mohamed Hefeeda is new School of Computing Science Director.

Ken Chan: Columbia College

Enrolments are up. Rental \$700,000 for another floor across from the College.

Bill Klug: BCIT

Co-Chairs deal with students and other with curriculum

Average GPA moved to 90%. Looking at entrance exams so that credentials mean something. Solve the waitlist problem. CIS moved to downtown but do not have labs. Monitors mounted on the walls and walls are glass for writing on the walls.

Nahid Taheri: College of New Caledonia

Programming is taught in Java.

Northwest Community College: Ezahran Zahrai

Name change: Coast Mountain College

Two courses: Introduction to programming in Python. Mexico and India are International Students. Two Faculty. Associate Degree in Science and Art.

Coquitlam College: Megan O'Connor:

Some courses were cut and other courses added. Mobile Apps with Android. Completely International. Starting to see South Asian population. More plagiarism and cheating.

Dave Casperson: UNBC

We have been working on the following new programs: • Masters in Data Science: approved by board in Feb 2018; admissions opened for another week with the program starting in Sep 2018. The number of students registered in computer science courses increased by 23% since last year. Our campus has now reached 100% capacity with computer science growing faster than other disciplines.

Larry Maki: College of the Rockies

Need to deal with Cheating and Plagiarism at a higher level. This is taking up too much of faculty time. Promoting Academic Honesty Task force.

Action: Study underway for International students. Should be a Ministry mandated initiative theme and not a matter of BCCAT. The council takes these issues to be focused.

Mike Zastra: UVic

Conference WCCCE 2018 there is a paper on Academic Integrity. Paper section D.

Abdallah Mohamed: UBC O

Switching from Blackboard to Canvas. More interaction choices for students.

Mohd Abdullah: TRU

TRU Waitlist handling is looking at raising GPA requirement.

Offer courses in the Summers to offload waitlists.

Hiring 3 more positions.
