Update from BCCAT (Fiona McQuarrie)

- In the last few months everyone is working from home, trying to navigate the shift to online, everyone has been accommodating and flexible
- Annual joint annual meeting (JAM) is November 4 & 5

- BCCAT is working on funding and supporting research projects carried out by articulation committees - Example: to improve transfer issues faced by committee or discipline
- Each institution has a transfer credit contact person and they should have a list of outstanding requests that have been received but not resolved
 - o Contact this person to see if there are any outstanding courses that need articulation

Committee decision to support the Flexible Pre-major in (a) Sociology; (b) Anthropology (Jen Wrye/Fiona McQuarrie/committee)

- Flexible Pre-major (FPM) introduced in late 2000's
- This is a block transfer system that allowed students to take a certain number of courses and transfer those into advanced standing with a degree granting institution (third year standing)
- May / June 2019 - Challenges in existing programs with maintaining, tracking usage, and determining whether or not students were benefitting from FPM
- BCCAT announced August 2020 that they would no longer be supporting the FPM in any of the disciplines
 - o BCCAT will not update FPM in the transfer guide, will not solicit information, and anything that does exist will be listed as "for reference" only, not as active
 - This means that institutions would be responsible for the maintenance and communication
 - If we do not continue with FPM then we can look at other viable options that do exist and explore those avenues (BCCAT has suggested other options)

- The main motivation of FPM was to support students and from BCCATs perspective, there were few committees updating these listings and knowledge of programs came to dissipate
 - BCCAT no longer supporting the program does not preclude committee members from reviving them on an institutional basis
 - Responsible of maintenance and updating of agreements would fall to the institutions
 - This program was set up during a time when students would go to college and do two years in a particular discipline and then transfer to a university to do third and fourth year (the BC Transfer system developed from this model), but this model has evolved

 - FPM was province-wide whereas a block transfer is institution to institution
