Introduction

The provincial nursing articulation committee is pleased to submit this final report to the BC Council on Admissions and Transfers. This final report includes examples of criteria which programs may use to grant transfer credit and it is also a **guide for course articulation** for the first two years of nursing programs. These courses are broadly organized around the following content and/or concepts (no specific framework is used):

- Human Anatomy And Physiology
- Theory Related To Health
- Communication
- Professionalism
- Psychomotor Skills
- Nursing Practice
- Required Non-Nursing Courses
- Theory Related to Management of Illness/Disease Processes
- Advanced Communication
- Advanced Psychomotor Skills

The specific courses identified in this guide **do not** indicate that credit or equivalency will be granted. Each nursing program determines course credit and equivalency.

*In addition to specific courses, the following criteria may also be used to determine the transfer or acceptance of courses, semesters, or year from one nursing program to another (Depends upon the policies of the individual institution).
