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## Methodology

BC Stats worked with the BC Council on Admissons and Transfer (BCCAT) and the Ministry of Advanced Education, Skills and Training (AEST) to review and update the 2012 survey questionnaire. The survey targeted students who were registered in one or more BC public post-secondary institutions in Fall 2018 and were enrolled in at least one different BC public post-secondary institutions between September 2016 and August 2018.

Data from the Student Transitions Project (STP) were used to identify students for inclusion in the cohort. Graduate and continuing education students enrolled in Fall 2018 were excluded as were those who received a Baccalaureate or higher credential from the institution(s) attended previously. From this cohort of 33,332 students, Diploma, Associate Degree, Certificate, Apprenticeship, Trades Foundation, and Trades-Related Vocational students who were eligible to participate in the respective Student Outcomes survey were excluded for an eligible cohort of 29,780. Contact information for students in the cohort was provided by the institution at which the student was registered in Fall 2018.

The survey was conducted by BC Stats via the web from February 26 to June 9, 2019. Each institution was given the option to provide dates during which invitations and reminders would not be sent. An invitation email and up to five reminders were sent during the course of the field period.

#### Margin of error:

The margin of error on any given question varies, depending on how close the statistic is to 50% and how large the sample size is relative to the population size. The margin of error for SYSTEM in Table 40, "Satisfaction with Experience of Moving Between Institutions" is 11.8% (69.6% responded "Very satisfied" or "Satisfied" output for the population correction factor. That is, if the survey were conducted repeatedly, the proportion of respondents answering "Very satisfied" or "Satisfied" and 11.4%, 19 times out of 20. The unweighted sample size for SYSTEM in a 45,03.

#### Weighting:

Results were weighted by institution, age group, gender, aboriginal identity status, and international student status to ensure the results were representative of transfer students. Total respondent counts are unweighted. Results for the 2012 survey remain unweighted.

#### Comparisons to 2012 Survey:

Results from the 2012 survey are presented for convenience, with the understanding that the population of mobile students in 2019 was significantly more inclusive. No adjustments have been made to the 2012 data to reflect the differences in the survey population.
