





The Survey of Mobile Students, conducted in collaboration with BC Stats, inquired with transfer students ("movers") about their paths, goals, decisions, and experiences within the BC transfer environment.

Data collected through the survey help explain students' profiles and pathways-who mobile students are, how they move, and why they change institutions-and inform future research, policies, and practices supporting post-secondary movers in the BC Transfer System.





PREVIOUS EDUCATION

Most survey respondents (53% overall) entered their previous institution in Fall 2016 with high school graduation as the highest level of education completed. Younger movers were most likely to have high school completion as their highest educational level; older movers tended to have had post-secondary learning and/or a credential.




PREVIOUS POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION BY IBINARY GENDER

Women were more likely than men to have completed previous post-secondary education; this information is consistent with mobile student demographics as well as general demographic trends in post-secondary education.

Those starting at a research-intensive university (RIU) tended to have only high school completion; this data aligns with Student Transitions Project (STP) and other research that shows a tendency for students in that institution type to enroll immediately after high school graduation.
