Technology Update


BCCAT has a number of projects currently underway to expand the tools and services provided by the Transfer Credit System (TCS) to support BC transfer system members.

In collaboration with the Ontario Council on Articulation and Transfer (ONCAT), BCCAT has created a customized version of the TCS that will enable Ontario post-secondary institutions to use the same platform as BC for transfer and articulation. This opens the door to greater sharing of course information between Ontario and BC, along with shared development of new features to enhance the TCS.

BCCAT is currently working with the BC Credit Bank at Thompson Rivers University to expand the TCS to support the storing of micro-credential pathways for transfer credit. This initial phase of work is part of a broader project to expand articulation of micro-credentials within the BC Transfer System.

Finally, BCCAT is piloting a new pathways tool within the TCS, to enable program to program articulation. This tool will provide BC transfer system members tools to assess program progression, and build pathway program articulation agreements with each other.

Sessions on all these initiatives will be held at JAM 2025.
