Joint Annual Meeting (JAM)

Planning for BCCAT's annual JAM (Joint Annual Meeting) has begun. This year's event will be held on Thursday, November 5 and Friday, November 6, and will be online. Registration is free, and will open in late summer. Anyone involved with or interested in transfer credit is more than welcome to attend.



Technology Update

BCCAT's upcoming technology work involves using artificial intelligence (AI) to facilitate the work of the BC Transfer System. In partnership with the BC Credit Bank led by Thompson Rivers University, and supported by the Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills' Post-Secondary Digital Learning Strategy, BCCAT intends to develop an application that will evaluate non-credit micro-credentials for academic credit. With the accelerated use of artificial intelligence, this is an opportune time to develop a technical solution to facilitate the assessment of micro-credentials for the BC Transfer System.

BCCAT also plans to use AI as a foundational component of scaling the articulation and administration of similar work in existing BCCAT technologies: namely the Transfer Credit System (TCS classic) and TCS Pathways. The implementation plan will integrate AI into TCS Classic and TCS Pathways applications, which will also facilitate integration with external partners' data sets.

New TAC Members

TAC (Transfer and Articulation Committee) is the standing committee of BCCAT Council that provides oversight to BCCAT's 60+ articulation committees. TAC recently welcomed two new members: Rob-Roy Douglas (instructional faculty, Northern Lights College) and Vance Mattson (instructional faculty, College of the Rockies).

Elizabeth McCausland (Douglas College) and Dezene Huber (UNBC) have completed their terms as TAC members. BCCAT thanks them for their contributions to the committee.
